Stop 1: Take a Guided Tour of the Ziibiwing Cultural Center

Your experience in Mt. Pleasant begins at the Ziibiwing Cultural Center, an award-winning museum that unveils the rich history and traditions of the Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe and the Anishinaabe people. Attendees are invited to shop at the Ziibiwing Gift Shop following the tour. The gift shop includes Pendleton items, handmade jewelry, and other unique items that reflect Anishinaabe artistry.

Stop 2: Cup Of Joy

Following the tour, head over to Cup of Joy to enjoy a sampling of traditional Indigenous foods such as fry bread, blanket dogs, corn bread soup or other seasonal specialties while learning about the cultural significance of Indigenous culinary traditions.


Stop 3: Soaring Eagle Casino

Test your luck with a slot tournament at the biggest gaming floor in Michigan, Soaring Eagle Casino. Groups can also get a tour of the casino.

Stop 4: Central Michigan University

Head to Central Michigan University and gain insight on the relationship and partnership between the university and the Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe.
